

Sample Prohibited Items List (April 2024)

To facilitate efforts to maintain safe and secure shipboard environments for passengers and crew throughout the global cruise itinerary, this Sample Prohibited Items List includes items that the security professionals of CLIA's Members have identified as potentially being dangerous or posing a risk to the crew, passengers, or ship. Possession by passengers or crew of these items is generally not permissible without a valid lawful reason, unless required in direct support of ship operations, as part of a crew member's official duties, and with consent of a duly authorized ship representative.

This document is provided in an editable format that each cruise line can tailor to individual Company requirements, if appropriate. Each cruise line may:

- adapt relevant portions of this Sample Prohibited Items List to existing fleet or ship-specific plans based on ship size and design, itinerary location and duration and other relevant considerations;
- modify or delete provisions of this Sample Prohibited Items List that may not apply operationally to a specific ship;
- develop their own procedures for how to allow appropriate and justified exceptions;
- review this Sample Prohibited Items List periodically with ship-specific plans to consider appropriate modifications.

Prohibited Items

Narcotics/Drugs

Any illegal narcotics/drugs

Weapons

- 1. All firearms including replicas, imitations and their components¹
- 2. Air, BB or pellet pistols or rifles
- 3. Any other projectile-weapon (e.g., paint ball guns)
- 4. All ammunition
- 5. Sharp pointed weapons including throwing stars
- 6. Knives with a blade longer than 4 inches/10.16 cm ^{2,3}
- 7. Open Razors
- 8. Skean Dhus or Kirpans ^{2,4}
- 9. Spears or spear guns
- 10. Crossbows, crossbow bolts and long bow arrows
- 11. Blunt weapons including knuckle dusters, brass knuckles, clubs, coshes, batons, flails or nunchaku
- 12. Any other item made, adapted or intended for use as an offensive weapon
- 13. Stun devices

Flammable Items/Explosives/Hazardous Chemicals

- 1. All explosives, including imitation explosives and devices²
- 2. Fireworks, flares, pyrotechnics (excluding those which are part of the vessel's lifesaving equipment and which have been properly manifested)²
- 3. Items containing incapacitating substances (e.g. gas guns, tear gas sprays, mace, phosphorus, acid and other dangerous chemicals that could be used to maim or disable)²
- 4. Flammable substances and hazardous chemicals unless carried in limited quantities and in accordance with company instructions (e.g., petrol methylated spirits, paint thinners, etc.)^{2,5,6}
- 5. Large batteries ^{2,6}
- Items brought onboard the vessel and not supplied by the Company containing any kind of heating element, such as but not limited to: Immersion heaters, heating blankets, flat irons, water heaters, coffee machines with heating/hot plates, etc. ⁶

Electronics devices capable of:

- 1. Data scraping
- 2. Signal spoofing
- 3. Signal jamming
- 4. Any other deliberate electronic interference which would constitute criminal activity

Restricted Items

Electronics/Remoted Controlled Devices

- 1. Any remotely controlled or autonomously flying devices, toys or drones ^{2,5}
- 2. Self-balancing hover boards, air wheels, scooters, or Segways (except those provided by the Company for shore excursions)
- 3. Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacons (EPIRB), ham radios, satellite phones, transformers, lasers and laser pointers ²

Compressed Gasses

 Compressed gas tanks, bottles, cylinders including dive tanks, propane tanks and aerosol cans.²

¹Except Law Enforcement Officers/Agents acting in an official capacity and/or certified Armed Security Guards acting in an official capacity with full permission of the Ship's Master.

²Except when authorized by the Ship's Master, the Company Security Officer (CSO) or their designee.

³ Souvenir Ulu knives may be retained if kept in original packaging and stored by, or as directed by, the ship's security department.

⁴Ceremonial knives/swords as well as entertainment props are, at times, permitted with prior approval from the Ship's Master, the CSO or their designee, as appropriate, but are to be held in the custody of the ship's security department.

⁵ Except when authorized by the company in support of a sanctioned company activity, and with completion of a risk assessment by the Company's marine safety group.
